APLA President's Report APLA 2022 OGM

Thank you for an engaging and rewarding year

I would like to thank the Association, the APLA Executive, and all our volunteers for all the outstanding work they have done this year. This year has been a fulfilling one on a professional level and I've gained or honed several intangible career skills by working with my colleagues on the Executive Committee, our volunteers, and our members. I regret not having the chance to say "goodbye" to everyone at an in-person conference, but I remain optimistic that there will be opportunities to meet the majority of you face to face one day soon. Our Association continues to do important and excellent work responding to National events that affect our libraries and library workers in the region.

Our Advocacy Committee completed our Anti-racism statement, a new media policy was approved, and our Working Group that looked at governance structure will be putting forward a proposal at the Conference's pre-resolutions meeting to convert the positions of Secretary, Technological Coordinator, and Communications Coordinator to elected positions with voting privileges on the Executive Committee. We have also just recently formed an Intellectual Freedom interest group that will be convened by Chantale Saulnier (also APLA's VP New Brunswick). Our Technology Co-ordinator produced a revamped website, our interest group convenors are active, and our Grow A Library Committee has been working hard all year.

Finally, a special thank you to all of our members who engaged with me directly, or with any of our Executive Committee members or special interest groups over the last year. Our regional library association always strives to do great work and we can only be as strong as our membership and our volunteers.

Executive Committee

The Executive Committee has been busy this year. All meetings remained virtual due to Covid. Between formal meetings we have kept in touch via email several times per week.

The Partnership

This year The Partnership meetings remained in the format of shorter virtual round-table meetings. Cate Carlyle (VP-President Elect) and I have attended roundtables which allowed member associations to share our collective challenges and exchange ideas. These meetings have provided invaluable support and an exchange of ideas during these unusual times. Maintaining membership and supporting our members continue to be key items discussed at all meetings. However, there are additional challenges during Covid such as delays and cancellations in conferences, challenges of running a virtual conference, supporting library and library workers, and supporting library association workers and volunteers during

covid-19. Associations are stepping up and seeking ways to support their members. The Partnership: a national network of provincial and territorial library associations, has proved invaluable in this regard.

CFLA-FCAB

The sixth Annual General Meeting of the CFLA-FCAB occurred virtually on February 11th, 2022. As a member association, APLA participated in the meeting. Cate Carlyle (VP-President Elect) and I attended the AGM. Ann Smith (Past-President) was also in attendance as the Atlantic Region's representative (a two year term which will conclude at the 2023 CLFA AGM).

Finance Committee

Terri Winchcombe's time as Treasurer will come to an end in June; the incoming Treasurer is Margaret Vail. Many thanks to Terri for her terrific work as Treasurer and to Margaret for stepping into her new role with APLA. The Finance Committee has been busy. We met virtually on a number of occasions and have been in close communication via email with each other and with our banker - Jonathan Crotty, with TD. We have renewed GICs. This year, we finished with a surplus. We spent considerable time preparing a robust budget. We are cautiously optimistic about next year's budget. Due to loosening Covid restrictions, we are expecting more activity, but are still preparing for a potentially lean year of revenues whilst supporting opportunities for our members and community. Interest Groups

The interest groups have been busy this year due to the leadership and activity of their convenors and members. This grass-roots activity is especially important due to the postponement of the APLA Conference in 2020, the virtual formats of the 2021 and 2022 Conferences, as well as the overall lack of face-to-face activities we've been able to participate in over the last few years. The Aims & Objectives Committee is ably led by the Vice-President President Elect, Cate Carlyle.

It has been my pleasure and honour to serve as APLA VP President-Elect this past year. Our current President Marc Harper has been very helpful as I adjusted to the role, and to prepare me for the year ahead as I transition to the President role. Since my last report I have attended many APLA meetings, including the Spring Executive meeting on March 3^{ct}, as well as the meetings, consultations and activities described below.

The Partnership

In addition to attending all virtual Partnership meetings and retreats this past year, I also reached out to Destiny Laldeo at the Education institute. Destiny and I will be meeting in May to discuss APLA revenue from EI offerings as well as plan for the future to increase APLA member involvement.

Committee on Aims and Objectives, and Interest Groups

In my role as VP I have been overseeing the APLA Aims and Objectives Committee and supporting the four Interest Groups: Continuing Education, Information Literacy, Government Information, and Library Staff & Technicians. In addition, I have been supporting the Library Staff & Technicians Interest Group as they have rolled out PD opportunities for their members and are preparing to present at the conference in June.

Finance Committee

The committee met to discuss the current budget and to discuss the draft budget for 2022-23. Additional discussion and meetings occurred throughout the year via email. We balanced the budget and also expressed the need to focus on increasing membership in the coming year to balance out increased expenditures and the return to costs involved in Executives attending in-person meetings and conferences.

Carin Alma E. Somers Scholarship Trust Fund Committee

I promoted the scholarship fund via my network, APLA listserv, social media, and Discord as well as to MLIS programs. We had no applicants so the deadline was extended a few extra weeks. Financial Examiner Report 2021/22 – Peter Glenister

To the members of the Atlantic Provinces Library Association

I have examined for integrity and accuracy the financial records of the Atlantic Provinces Library Association as at 31 March, 2022, including the statements of operations, functional expenses, changes in fund balances and changes in financial position for the year then ended. My examination was conducted by applying risk assessment standards for not-for-profit organizations and, accordingly, included such tests and procedures as I considered necessary in the circumstances. In preparation for my review of the Association's records I corresponded with the Treasurer to receive the necessary documents and to clarify certain points.

In my opinion the Statement of Revenues and Expenditures and balance Statement represent fairly the financial position of the organization and its investments as at 31 March, 2022, and the results of its operations and the changes in its financial position for the year then ended, in accordance with the notes to the Statement, have been applied on a basis consistent with that of preceding years. As of that date, the aggregate of assets is \$141,687.72 and the Association's equity is also \$141,687.72. The increase of \$16,181.52 in assets has occurred because the Association's current accounts include funds (\$23,802.42) previously held as investments for the First Timers Conference Grant.

I included in my examination, in accord with Standing Order 3.10, the Carin Alma E. Somers Scholarship Fund and, in my opinion, the Statement of Revenues and Expenditures and the balance Statement represent fairly the financial position of the Fund as at 31 December, 2021. With respect to reports of previous years, the Association has continued to absorb the expense of tax return submission. The equity of the Somers Fund was \$82,252.52 as of 31 December, 2021.

Also in accord with Standing Order 3.10, I have examined the financial records of the APLA Memorial Awards Trust Fund and, in my opinion, the Statement of Revenues and Expenditures and the balance Statement represent fairly the financial position of the Trust Fund as at 31 December, 2020. Current investments are valued at \$34,692.83 and deposits of \$16,770.40 are in a current account creating an equity level of \$51,463.23. This reduction in equity has occurred in part because of the payment (\$3,063.47) of a General Activities Fund award from the Memorial Awards Trust Fund.

At the discretion of the Executive, Standing Order 3.09 directs that up to \$1,000 of any annual operating surplus may be transferred to the Memorial Awards Trust Fund and Standing Order 3.15 that 50% of any annual conference surplus be divided between the Memorial Awards Trust Fund and the First Timers Conference Grant; during 2021/2022 an amount of \$1332.00 was transferred to the First Timers Conference Grant.

Report for APLA OGM – June 2022 APLA Information Literacy Interest Group May 4, 2022

The APLA Information Literacy Interest Group has been active over the past year (since the APLA OGM in June 2021 to present) with two projects. Both projects are meant to support professional development regarding information literacy.

The first project involves curating bimonthly emails by individual group members with links relevant to information literacy. After they are compiled, Agnieszka Hayes, Convener, sends out the emails to the APLA listsery on behalf of the individual curators. This project is continuing from last year.

Virtual meetings of the group took place on Google Meet and revolved around planning for the second project. The second project is the creation of virtual drop-in learning spaces that allow participants to discuss information literacy topics. These sessions are free to attend and open to anybody who has an interest in information literacy, regardless of their employment status, job title, or institutional affiliation. The first virtual drop-in learning space took place on November 18, 2021 via Zoom, and was co-hosted by group members K-Lee Fraser and Nicole Marcoux. The focus for this session was on how to approach teaching a particular concept, and the goal was for early career information professionals to be able to talk to, and receive advice and guidance from mid- to late career information professionals, as well as ask questions and offer advice in return from their perspective. The second virtual drop-in learning space took place on March 31, 2022 via Google Meet, and was hosted by Agnieszka Hayes. The focus for this session was on lessons learned and opportunities for growth from mistakes made while teaching. Both events had active participants, who evaluated the sessions positively.

The next session will take place on June 9, 2022, at the virtual APLA 2022 Conference, and will be cohosted by Agnieszka Hayes, K-Lee Fraser, and Nicole Marcoux. The event will start with a conference presentation providing the background behind the sessions and reporting on the experience of hosting them, as well as a question and answer session. Session participants will be invited to stay and participate in an optional drop-in learning session as part of their professional development. The theme for this session will focus on exploring teaching tools that participants have heard of and may wish to try in their future instruction sessions.

The APLA 2022 Conference session will also serve as an introduction to the APLA Information Literacy Interest Group for conference attendees who are not familiar with the group and its work. The hope is that this session will inspire participants to join the group, and thereby the group's work will be enhanced with their perspectives and contributions.

The Convener is planning to schedule a meeting of the group sometime after the conference.

CFLA-FCAB Board

This year we welcomed Lorisia MacLeod as the incoming Chair of the CFLA-FCAB Board. In 2019-2020 Lorisia served as the Indigenous Matters Representative on the Board. Also at the February 11th meeting we welcomed Hélène Carrier as Vice-Chair, Jessica Knoch as Secretary, and Andrea Cecchetto as Treasurer. I continue as the Board Liaison to the CFLA-FCAB Copyright Committee. CFLA-FCAB sent a pre-budget brief to the federal government with a number of requests, including issues of access to e-content, equitable access to reading materials for people with print disabilities, green infrastructure funding for libraries, and funding for LAC to respond to Access to Information requests. CFLA-FCAB successfully coordinated the Canadian nominations for the IFLA elections. There are 10 Canadian members. CFLA-FCAB expressed support for Ukraine in *Canadian Library Community Expresses Support for Ukraine*. In 2022-23 CFLA-FCAB will be bringing forwards its new Strategic Plan.

Cataloguing and Metadata Standards

The Final Report Canadian BIBFRAME Readiness is now available from the CFLA-FCAB website.

Copyright

The Copyright Committee is active and has produced a number of position papers and statements, including the substantive *Response to Consultation on a Modern Copyright Framework for Online Intermediaries*, which was jointly submitted with CARL and CULC and endorsed by a number of library associations, including APLA. CFLA-FCAB issued a statement of support for the major win for libraries and educators in *Unanimous Supreme Court of Canada Decision is a Major Win for Education and Libraries in Canada: Confirms Tariffs Not Mandatory and Reiterates Users' Rights and Fair Dealing Principles*. Another substantive response from CFLA-FCAB/CARL to the government's work in the area of copyright is *Government of Canada's Consultation on a Modern Framework for Artificial Intelligence and the Internet of Things*. Working Groups of the Committee prepared a paper on *Controlled Digital Lending of Library Books in Canada*, and wrote an op-ed on Crown Copyright. The work on Crown Copyright led to follow-up from Parliamentarians and officials. The Committee works with Impact Public Affairs to advance CFLA information policy positions with government officials on a regular basis.

Indigenous Matters

This year CFLA-FCAB has commenced renewal of the Indigenous Matters Committee. The Indigenous Matters Committee has a new Chair, Kirk MacLeod, and a call for new members will go out in the near future.

Intellectual Freedom

The Intellectual Freedom Committee ran its Intellectual Freedom Challenges Survey. CFLA-FCAB produced an open response in a statement of support for libraries withstanding pressure to withdraw a controversial book. The Intellectual Freedom Committee produced a position paper on *Protest and Disagreement related to collections, Programs and Speakers in Libraries. An Interpretation of the Canadian Federation of Library Associations' Statement on Intellectual Freedom and Libraries.*
